Dear Members and Friends.

Today is Rosh Chodesh Elul, the first day of the Hebrew month that inaugurates the High Holiday season. Starting today, we blow the shofar each morning and recite Psalm 27 during the morning and evening service. It is a rich psalm that emphasizes the closeness we feel to G-d. Perhaps the most well-known line is verse 4, which has been turned into songs by dozens of contemporary Jewish musicians (as a quick search on YouTube demonstrates; my own favourite is this version by Shalsheles).

One thing I ask of the LORD, only that do I seek: to live in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD, to frequent His temple.

Attached you will find information about all the holiday services, which once again will feature the outstanding Justin Goodman as our lead chazzan. I invite you to be a frequent presence in our beautiful synagogue, not only during the High Holidays but also throughout the year. It is your involvement that keeps the Kiever Shul going, so please take this opportunity to renew your membership. And if you are not already a member, please consider demonstrating your support for our historic downtown synagogue by submitting an application.

The High Holidays are a time of thanks and renewal, so this is an opportune moment for me to inform you that David Moyal has recently been appointed officially to the position of Executive Director. We are grateful to David for his daily work keeping the Kiever running smoothly, usually in unseen ways that range from arranging simchas and leading community tours of the building, to coordinating gardening activities with Shoresh and dealing with the complexities of the Bereavement Authority of Ontario. We look forward to David taking an even more public role in representing the synagogue at, for example, the Downtown Jewish Community Council.
